Eligibility Criteria

Startups fitting the following profile are invited to apply:

- A FinTech or technology startup
- Have a minimum viable product (MVP) and early trial with customers
- Armed with seed stage funding
- Based out of Singapore or willing to relocate startup to Singapore

Winning teams to receive

- Access to talent from within and outside PayPal
- Access to funding through PayPal's network and VC connections
- An environment which promotes collaboration and innovation, where startups can grow and feed off each other's energy, creativity and support
- Coaching and mentorship by PayPal executives and external business/technical subject matter experts
- Prime co-working space at PayPal Singapore's Technology Center located at Suntec City
- Structured learning conducted by experts in the FinTech industry. Finance and technology topics such as risk, compliance, core payment network, channel partnering etc., will be covered in the curriculum

Judging Criteria

Startups will be judged on the following:

- Team – Technical capability, business background, commitment
- Business model and market – Scalability of the business, market size, barriers to entry
- Technological innovation – Innovation of the technology, defensibility of technology, competitiveness
- Traction – Early traction and market viability

Each team will be given 15 minutes to present their ideas, as well as address questions from the judges.

Winners will be notified from 3 June onwards and the first incubation cycle will begin on 6 June.
